6. Principal's Report & Business Arising from Report: Jennifer Keene

- 1. Holy Name Hurrah: Since the return of school we have been focusing on catching students when they demonstrate acts of kindness. Staff fill in a Holy Name Hurrah ballot which is entered in daily draws for prizes. These students are mentioned daily during our morning announcements. At the end of the month of February we will put all ballots into a final draw for larger prizes. The students have been working hard to demonstrate acts of kindness in the school building and in the school yard.
 - -CSAC brainstormed some ideas to keep the momentum in this program since it has been so positive putting winning ballots on bulletin boards, prize for the whole school at the end (extra recess, cupcakes), putting total ballots on display in jug outside office, having goal number of ballots to reach, engage grade 8 class that they can give Hurrah to younger students.
- 2. Intramurals during lunch recess have begun with basketball for our Gr. 7 and 8 students and Bordanball for our Gr. 5 and 6 students.
- 3. A media club has also begun for our Gr. 8 students during morning recess and a games club will be starting soon.
- 4. Kindergarten to Gr. 8 students have been participating in skating
- 5. A new noon hour monitor has been hired- her name is Miranda Reason. She started last week and has been hired for 5 days/ week
- 6. Donating a slice for pizza days provided 30 students a slice of pizza on pizza days during the month of January. We have set this up for our new orders for the months of February and March.
- 7. For the months of February /March we had 123 slices donated- we have made arrangements for 107 slices of pizza to be donated to specific students- the remainder of the slices will help us for our last pizza order of the year).

8. PRO Grant funds available

All CSACs and schools are once again invited to access Parents Reaching Out (PRO) funds. Each school CSAC has been allocated \$ 552.

The PRO grants program provides funding to school boards to lead projects with a focus on the identification and removal of barriers that prevent parents and families from participating and engaging fully in their children's learning. Funds must be spent by June 30, 2024. The spending of these funds is to be done in consultation with the CSAC. In addition to the PRO Grant each CSAC has been allocated \$500 to further support their initiatives.



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Projects to support the diversity of parent needs and parent communities at the local level through an equity and inclusion lens. Projects could include:

- Development of parent resources (i.e. mental health & well-being, anti-racism)
- Delivery of parent information sessions (how to support children & families at home)
- Delivery of parent engagement sessions (networking)
- Innovative activities that enable enhanced and diversified parent Engagement

CSAC felt these funds can be used for the WWFF (Warrior Will Fun Fair) used to encourage all families to participate and network with other families in school community

-future plans for another event earlier in the year to engage parents ideas welcome, bowling, trivia night

We felt there is room for more parent engagement throughout the year and what is the best way to reach out

- -parent email list, must volunteer their names, ?collected at the open house ?request sent from school if allowed
- -some parents feel they are not aware of things they can help with or were help is needed
- -teacher providing a list of things parents can participate in (making playdough, helping with skip counting, ways to engage in classroom if help is needed)

***Current volunteer needs: WWFF (planning, reaching out to venders and prize contributors), Shrove Tuesday, CSAC committee, Hot Lunch coordination (see below)

7. Policy Review: nothing to review

-We discussed some of the policy changes that were reviewed in September and how they affect class trips and the WWFF, and why other boards may not have these policies. This is something that comes from the board and would need to be brought up with the School board Trustee.

- Hockey Nets to be replace: Facebook group asked for donations if non provided CSAC approved \$400 for net purchase, Goalie equipment will also be purchased as it was approved last year.
